Dear friend, listen well to my words; tune your ears to my voice. Keep my message in plain view at all times. Concentrate! Learn it by heart! Those who discover these words live, really live; body and soul, they're bursting with health. Proverbs 4:20-22 The Message

Old Business:

Final Budget Approval

Lee Smith discussed final 2020 budget and thanked those who attended the budget presentation at the adult forum. Based on what heard during the presentation, no changes were required to the proposed budget. Hearing no other necessary revisions from Council, a motion was provided to accept the proposed fiscal budget for 2020 as submitted.

Erick thanked Lee for budget and nomination committee assistance. Copies of the approved budget will be printed for distribution at the congregational meeting.

Approval October Council Meeting Minutes:

Motion to approve as written and moved to be accepted as printed was seconded. Council approved the October Council meeting minutes.

It was noted that Council will be moving towards more electronic-driven efforts in order to be better environmental stewards and will be reducing the amount of printed copies of distributed materials at Council meetings. Please make sure to read emails in advance.

Reports:

Executive Council Report

Written report provided.

Noted conversations:

- Special Congregational Meeting- Sunday, November 24 at 10 a.m. in Fellowship Hall following worship will lead right into the meeting and then the potluck. Three things will

be covered: Council elections voting (slate of 4 with potential for write-ins if any nominations on the floor); Budget 2020 approval (if not approved must go back to the budget committee); and, approval for stain glass windows.

- Autumn Festival 2020- Date was announced for September 19, 2020. Additional planning details forthcoming.

Pastor's Report

Written report provided.

Noted conversations:

- Elevator update/TKE outreach (not noted in the report)- Pastor Lesley reached out to TKE for an update on the guide wheels. Once we have a response, we will be updated with additional information.
- Parkinson's Group Update- Beginning January 3rd, St. John's will be hosting a Parkinson's support group on Thursdays each month. Doubled checked with St. John's Preschool regarding maintaining safety for Pre-K students with external groups on campus. Amended rental contract to include providing a St. John's staff or designee to serve as an escort should an external group attendee need access to the second floor while the preschool is in operating hours.
- Nursery Guidelines: The nursery has had visitors who are minors but above the permitted kindergarten-age allowed in the nursery during service hours. Council reviewed, discussed, and approved a statement from the Council to be included as a reminder in the church newsletter.
- Church Bulletin Discussion: Council reviewed and revised a statement from Council for inclusion in the newsletter regarding a bulletin graphic inquiry from a congregational member. Council also discussed the value of providing an inviting worship and fellowship environment for community members.

Vicar's Report

Written report provided.

Noted conversations:

- Exploring an updated, online church directory that would be password protected for church families access only and an easier means in which to provide current information about our St. John's family. Will have additional information and photographer dates in the new year.

Treasurer's/Financial Ministry Report:

Written report provided.

Noted conversations:

- We will not be asking for funding donations for specific projects before the end of the year. However, we will still be accepting incoming elevator funds and additional capital funding for ongoing projects, such as the stained glass windows renovations.

Ministry Team Reports:

- Family Ministry
 - At their December meeting, the ministry team will discuss potential 2020 events, implementation of family surveys for community, and defining family and this ministry team's vision at St. John's.
 - Looking to create an email distribution list for interested St. John's community members.
- Property Ministry
 - Youth Room Thermostat-looked into getting a thermostat that will be compatible with system
 - Sump Pump Cover Installed in Youth Room
 - 1st Floor Ladies Restroom Accessibility Upgrades- Larry Addison was thanked for installing handles in the ladies restrooms.
 - Stone Removal-Someone is going to start to take some of the stone and chip off so can stack it in the wall.
 - Floor Maintenance- Scott has done well with the floor maintenance.
 - Comprehensive Capital Projects List- We will be building comprehensive list of capital projects and will get to Council to see in the next few months. This list will have items defined as needs for general up-keep and other potential major projects, such as enhancing technology in the sanctuary. Once the list is compiled, prices for the projects will be researched and then a plan of action will be drafted in coordination with Synod Council VP. Council is encouraged to think of any projects and to submit these to Executive Council.

No other ministry reports or updates provided.

Correspondence:

Current St. John's member submitted request to host a family event in December. Council approved this request.

New Business:

Appreciation/Love Offering

Council discussed and approved to collect a free-will monetary appreciation/love offering for paid lay staff only (similar to what has been done for previous vicar).

December Council Meeting and Social Time

Once confirm dates from Donna, we can just do it here on December 16th. Festive sweaters.

Calendar Highlights:

- The Cantata will be on December 15th, which is also One Service and Youth-Led Sunday.
- Breakfast for Santa is December 8th.
