

FIRST READING Isaiah 25:1-9

After a hymn of praise acknowledging God as a shelter for the poor, the prophet portrays a wonderful victory banquet at which death—which in ancient Canaan was depicted as a monster swallowing up everyone—will be swallowed up forever. The prophet urges celebration of this victory of salvation.

<sup>1</sup>O LORD, you are my God; I will exalt you, I will praise your name; for you have done wonderful things, plans formed of old, faithful and sure. <sup>2</sup>For you have made the city a heap, the fortified city a ruin;

the palace of aliens is a city no more,

it will never be rebuilt.

<sup>3</sup>Therefore strong peoples will glorify you;

cities of ruthless nations will fear you.

<sup>4</sup>For you have been a refuge to the poor,


